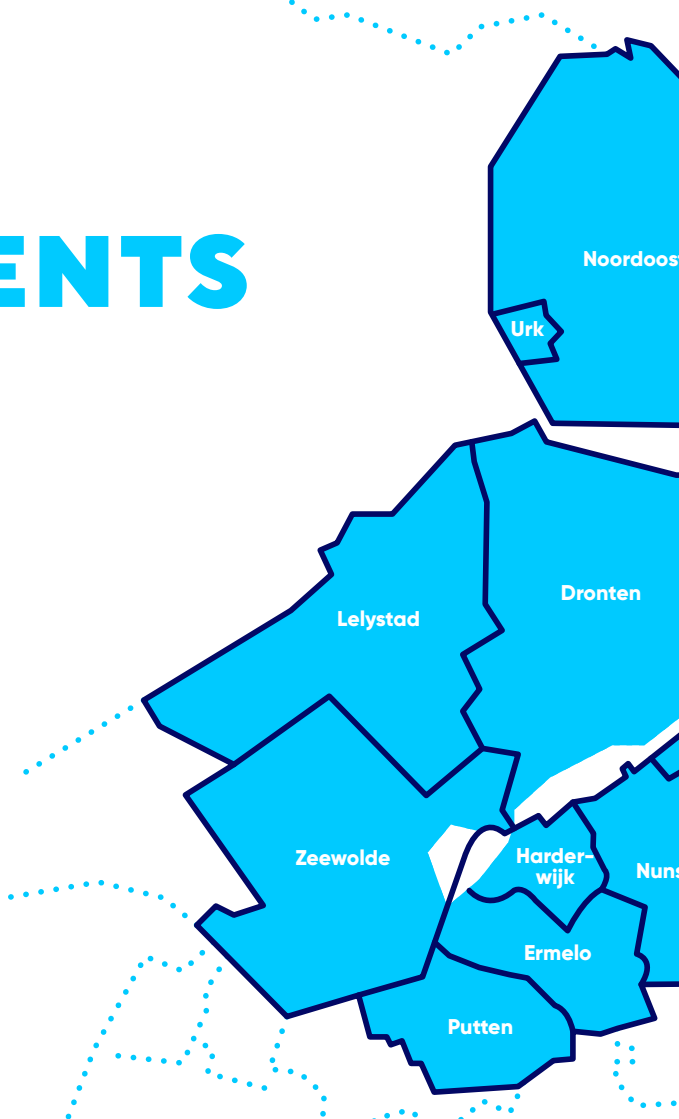
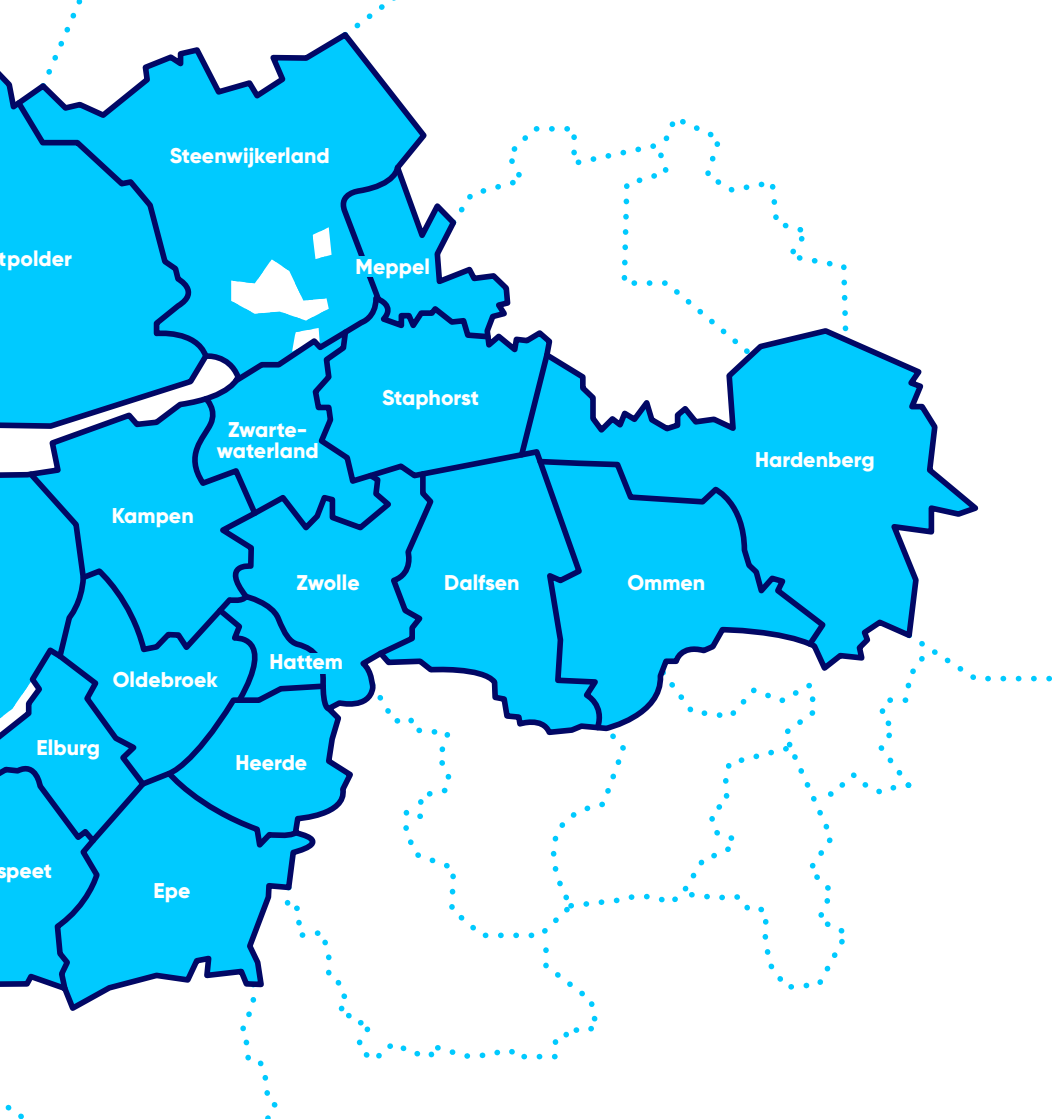

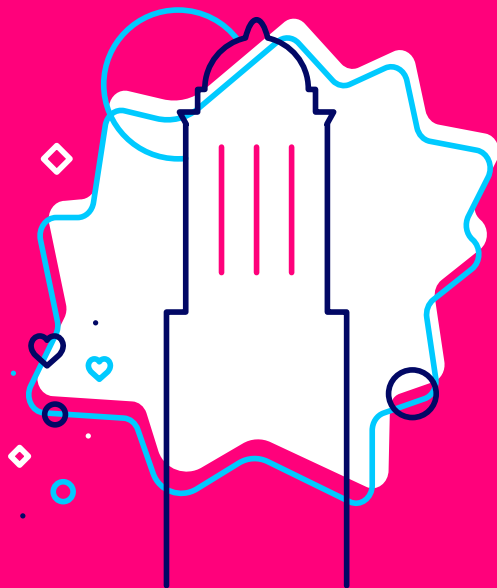


COC ZWOLLE

For over 40 years, COC Zwolle has been promoting the interests of lesbian women, gay men, bisexuals, transgender and intersex people (LGBT community).

We are committed to equal rights, emancipation, and social acceptance of LGBT people in our region. We strive for a society where people can develop to their full potential, regardless of their sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, and gender characteristics.

COC Zwolle therefore acts as an advocate for LGBT people, provides information and advice, educates, enters into discussions, and organises activities.

WHAT WE DO

Advocacy

COC Zwolle is represented as a LGBT advocate in political and administrative consultation bodies. We work together with municipalities, educational institutions, and local governments on the integration, visibility, and discussability of sexual and gender diversity. We discuss the safety of LGBT people in our region with the police and the judiciary.

Meeting

COC Zwolle stimulates and facilitates meetings and activities in line with our objective that everyone can, dares, and is allowed to be who they are. We organise meetings for young LGBT people up to 18 years of age, transgender people, elderly people, bicultural LGBT people and LGBT people with a disability.

We also organise consultation hours for LGBT refugees. We regularly organise a fun COC party.

Education

COC Zwolle provides information to pupils and students at schools, community centres, or religious institutions, to introduce them to sexual diversity and gender identity. The informative classes are interactive and let the participants think about their own norms and values regarding sexual diversity, discrimination, and bullying of LGBT people.



CAFÉ OKÉ

Café Oké offers a place where LGBT people with a (mild) mental and/or physical disability can be themselves and meet each other.

People without physical or mental disabilities are also welcome at Café Oké, as long as they are open to the purpose and target group of this environment. Every first Saturday afternoon of the month, you're welcome at Café Oké in the Enk in Zwolle.

In addition to meetings in the café, we visit events together, such as Roze zaterdag or a Café Oké location elsewhere in the country.

The visitors of Café Oké Zwolle are men and women of all ages and come from the wide surroundings of Zwolle.

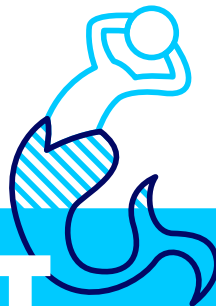

CLUB-T

Club-T is a place for trans men and trans women, but also for cross-dressers, gender queers, and for people who are still searching for their gender identity. In short, for everyone who feels connected to the transgender community for whatever reason.

Club-T is committed to social acceptance, visibility, and equal treatment of transgender people in our society.

Club-T organises a monthly meeting at Stichting Focus in Zwolle, with a relaxed and informative character.

It is a safe environment to be yourself and to meet others. There is also the

possibility to bring someone from your friends or family.

Once a month, we organise a Club-T consultation hour on Thursday or Friday. During these consultations, you can visit us for a one-on-one conversation, information, guidance, or other (personal) matters.

"For the first time in my life, I can talk about my homosexuality without being judged, scolded, or ignored."

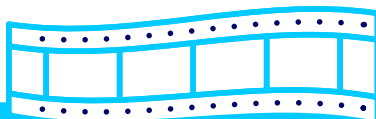
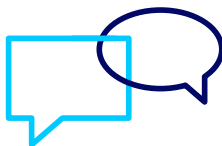
The COC Zwolle working group Connected organises consultation hours and meetings for LGBT refugees. Everyone wants to be connected. Everyone wants to belong and to live in freedom. Many LGBT people from countries like Jamaica, Uganda, Nigeria, Syria, Ukraine, and Russia flee to the Netherlands because they are not allowed to be who they are in their own country.

At the refugee's request, Connected offers a listening ear, facilitates introductions, acts as a reference point, and refers people to the right agencies. Connected works together with COA and refugee centre Midden-Nederland and is active in AZC Dronten, AZC Hardenberg and AZC Luttelgeest.

Education

Sexual diversity and gender identity are often controversial subjects. During an educational class, volunteers from COC Zwolle talk to participants about their own experiences and stories. The sessions are tailor-made and therefore suitable for all ages. They are interactive and make participants think about their own norms and values concerning sexual diversity and gender identity, and their place in society.

The information group at COC Zwolle provides more than 100 information sessions per year at various locations,

especially at schools. The information workers meet monthly for consultation and further training, and are supervised nationally.

SAFETY

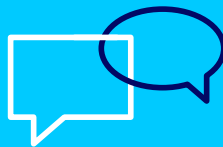
